The 19th century Danish Theologian Soren Kierkegaard once told a parable of a wild duck that became exhausted in the annual migration and was left behind by the other ducks. The duck landed in a farmer's barnyard where it was fed daily and associated with the tame ducks.

For a while, every time a flock of wild ducks flew over the barnyard, the duck had the urge to join them. But since life was so easy in the barnyard, it stayed. During all this time, the duck did not fly.

The next year a flock of wild ducks flew over. The "call of the wild" was so strong that the duck was determined to join them. Alas, when it tried to fly it, it could no longer do so. The duck had lost the ability by failing to use it.

Being a part of a local church for the Christian is much the same. Before you can spread your wings in flight you first have to condition them for effective use.
